According to Article 37 of the data protection regulations a privacy officer is not to be appointed.

The INTERNATIONAL POLICE ASSOCIATION (IPA) Austrian Section, Region Tyrol, will be hosting the 20th National Congress of the IPA Austrian Section and the event “60 Years IPA Austria”. To this end the IPA Region Tyrol will process all personal data you are providing in your online registration, especially first name and family name, title, email address, gender, and the IPA-organisation you are a member of. This data processing also applies to all personal data of your accompanying persons (first name, family name, age group, gender, e-mail address) which you will enter in the registration form. If you are a delegate, your IPA-IT-number and the IPA organisation you are a member of will be processed.

The basis for processing your personal data consists of

- a) your consent (in acc. with Article 6 Paragraph 1 (a) data protection regulations),
- b) in the need to process this data (in acc. with Art 6 Paragraph 2(b) data protection regulations) in order to fulfill the contract and all necessary pre-contractual measures (basing on your registration and the acceptance of your registration) between the IPA Region Tyrol and the participants,
- c) in the need to process this data in order to comply with the legal obligations of the IPA Region Tyrol (Art 6 Paragraph 1(c) data protection regulations),
- d) and in the need of safeguarding legitimate interests of the IPA Region Tyrol or third parties (Art 6 Paragraph 1(f) data protection regulations) in processing that data.

For optimising the website with regard to system performance, user-friendliness, and provision of useful information about the activities of the IPA, the provider of the website will automatically process information in so-called server log files which your browser will transmit automatically to the provider. This includes your IP address, your browser setting, your language setting, operating system, referrer URL, your internet service provider, and the date and time. This data will not be

merged with your personal data from the registration. But we reserve the right, to subsequently verify this data if we have solid evidence of unlawful use.

This website uses cookies to make it user-friendlier, more effective and safer. A cookie is a small text file which we send via our web-server to the cookie file of your browser on your computer's hard drive. Thus, it will be possible for our website to recognise you as a user, when a connection is established between our web-site and your browser. Cookies help us to check on the frequency of use and the number of users who visit our internet pages. The content of our cookies is limited to an identification number which does not permit a conclusion on the user. The main purpose of a cookie is the identification of the visitor of the website. This website uses two types of cookies: * so-called 'session cookies' – These are temporary files that remain in the cookie file of your browser and are automatically deleted when you leave our website.* so-called 'persistent or permanent cookies' – For the purpose of more user-friendliness, they will be stored in your terminal equipment and will enable us to recognise your browser upon your next visit. You can set your browser to inform you when a cookie is sent. So you can decide in each case whether or not to accept; you can further decide to refuse to accept cookies in certain cases, or generally exclude them, and you can activate the automatic deletion of cookies when closing the browser. It is also possible to completely deactivate cookies, but by not accepting cookies, the functionality of this website might be restricted.

The legitimate interests of the IPA Region Tyrol or third parties (Art 6 Paragraph 1(f) data protection regulations) in processing all your personal data provided at registration arise from the administration, organisation and the performance of the 20th National Congress of the IPA Section Austria in Seefeld in 2021, and they further arise from the management and organisation of your participation as well as of your accompanying person's participation in this congress.

The justified interest of the IPA Region Tyrol in video and sound recordings of the participants results from the documentation of this event for archiving purposes and from the need for media support for the public relations work of the IPA Region Tyrol.

For hosting and performing this event, it is a necessity to transfer your person-related data to third parties (such as gastronomic businesses, bus operators, organisers of parallel events of the XX. National Congress, other IPA regional groups or to IPA branches of the IPA Region Tyrol) but only to the absolutely necessary extent. For safety reasons it may further be necessary to check the IPA-membership of participants. If the need for transmitting personal data to a recipient outside of Austria should arise, and if that data will be processed in another country than Austria, we will transmit that personal data only to recipients in countries, which have been declared by the EU Commission to guarantee an adequate level of data protection. Apart from that we take appropriate steps to make sure that the recipient will provide adequate data protection such as standard contractual clauses (2010/87/EC and/or 2004/915/EC).

On principle, your person-related data will not be stored for any period longer than is necessary for the performance, conduct and settlement of the 20th National Congress. For defending against claims or for enforcing claims of the organiser, in particular with regard to fiscal obligations (for example paragraph 132 Federal Fiscal Code) or contractual obligations, it might be necessary to store your person-related data for a longer period of time.

However, you are entitled to request information about your stored person-related data, their origin, the recipient, and the purpose of processing your data. Furthermore, you are entitled to request a verification of your person-related data, and the transmission of your person-related data in an easily accessible and machine readable format. You are further entitled to request a restricted processing of your data, to have wrong or inadmissibly processed data to be either blocked or deleted; and you are entitled to object to the processing of your person-related data. In order to make sure that your person-related data are complete and correct you will receive an email confirming your data. We politely request you to carefully check the data you provided at your online-registration and – if necessary – to correct them either online or via the email address anmeldung-kongress-2020@amikeco.at (see “Kontakt” on our website).

You are entitled to withdraw your consent to the use of your personal data at any time. If your request for information, deletion, correction, or /and objection to processing your data would not give rise to disproportionate difficulties, then just send an email to the email address mentioned above .

If you are of the opinion that the processing of your person-related data by the IPA Region Tyrol would violate the EU data protection law, or if your data protection claims might have been violated in one way or another, there is a possibility to complain to the competent authorities: Österreichische Datenschutzbehörde, Barichgasse 40-42, A-1030, Vienna.

For concluding the contract on your participation and on the participation of your registered accompanying persons in the congress, it is necessary to provide your person related data. This is also necessary in order to fulfill the purpose of the registration and the contract. Without the provision of that data neither your participation nor the participation of your accompanying person can be administered. Thus, the conclusion of the contract is not possible.

With regard to the provided data of each individual accompanying person, the IPA Region Tyrol will assume that you will lawfully collect and process all that data, and that you are authorised to register the persons concerned.

We explicitly point to the fact that cancelling your agreement to the processing of your data as provided at registration might affect the contractual relationship between you and the organiser, the IPA Austrian Section, and may be considered a cancellation on your part, thus terminating the contract (see cancellation conditions).

Automated decision-making based on the collected data will not happen. The collected data will be exclusively used to ensure the organisational, and administrative performance as well as the impeccable accounting of the 20th National Congress.

In principle, the person-related data collected directly from you will not be processed. However, in order to conduct the organisational, and administrative performance as well as the impeccable accounting of the 20th National Congress it might be indispensable to collect person-related data not from you (see previous content of this data protection declaration – Art 13 data protection regulations).

Beyond this scope as mentioned above, it might be necessary to collect your data, first name and family name from gastronomic businesses, bus operators etc in order to find out whether or not you take part in the different event modules.

Basically, data which are not collected from you will not be stored for any period longer than is necessary for the performance, conduct and settlement of the 20th National Congress. For defending against claims or for enforcing claims of the organiser, in particular with regard to fiscal obligations (for example paragraph 132 Federal Fiscal Code) or contractual obligations, it might be necessary to store your person-related data for a longer period of time.
